What is "Duty to Consult & Accomodate"?

- The duty to consult and accommodate essentially means that when the Crown contemplates any action that that might adversely impact Aboriginal or treaty rights or title, it must consult with the relevant Indigenous groups and reasonably consider their interests provide and appropriate accommodation where necessary.
- This duty arises most often in the context of land development and natural resource extraction such as mining, forestry, oil, and gas as these activities often involve issues that can significant to indigenous groups.

The objective of the process set out in this MRIA framework document is to ensure Mi'gmag Rights are protected and to provide the next seven generations with healthy lands, waters and resources in order to maintain their culture and our Mi'gmag way of life. For all proposed activities in or near Mi'gmag Territory that may potentially impact or infringe Mi'gmaq Aboriginal or Treaty Rights or Title, the following process will apply for assessing the potential impacts on the exercise of Mi'gmag Rights and to assist in determining whether Mi'gmag consent will be granted for the activity.
